## Guidelines for Cross-Listing of Courses Curriculum Committee Last reviewed 10.20.09

Given that the faculty has decided against the cross-listing of courses in general, the Curriculum Committee is likely to approve exceptions only for courses that meet most or all of the following criteria:

- 1. Both departments have already approved the proposal.
- 2. There is sufficient difference between the two subject areas. CC is unlikely to approve cross-listing requests between an interdisciplinary program and a department that is normally home to any courses in that program.
- 3. There is a case to be made that there is a distinct benefit to students to have the course listed with a particular department. A "distinct benefit" might include, but is not limited to, attendency of graduate or professional schools to prefer students who have certain types of courses listed on their transcripts.
- 4. The course is team-taught by faculty members from different departments
